METHODOLOGY:** Quantitative and Qualitative Methods

The Rodgers Health Co-Occurring Disorder Program is an integrated and coordinated treatment program for medically indigent individuals in Kansas City with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health disorders. The goal of the program is to increase the functioning of its clients; while, decreasing emotional and physical pain and illegal substance use.

OVERVIEW: Evaluators worked with program staff to develop new client instruments. The evaluation of The Rodgers Health Co-Occurring Disorder Program involves a mixed-method design of self-report client data, Case Manager's observations, Monthly updates and focus groups. Resource Development Institute (RDI) enters, analyzes and reports the aggregate results of admission and monthly follow-up summaries of clients on a semi-annual basis.
